We didn't know how deep they would need to drill or how long the project would take. That was the scariest part. Well, on April 26, we got an email with pictures that the well was completed at 200 feet. This was an exciting time for all of us!

Last year we had shown you a picture of the toilet facilities at the school in Onitsha. The toilet was really not even able to be used. This had touched the heart of a group of people who had seen the need and a different toilet was erected. You have no idea what a blessing this was to the students!



It is with much joy and gladness I am writing. The month of April, 2012 was full of accomplishment for **I AM World Mission Outreach Nigeria**. Through the help of partners in the USA, a water well has been drilled at the headquarters in Onitsha Anambra State. This well will provide safe drinking water for people in the community. After the water was tested, the joy of both children and adult abounded as they fetched the water. One elderly woman said to me, "I can now drink clean and safe water in this neighborhood in my lifetime." She prayed for God's abundant blessings upon everybody who contributed towards the well.



I am happy to report that the church, apart from meeting the spiritual needs of the people, also tries to meet other needs, like providing food for the hungry and medical supplies for the sick. As they come to us, we have to place our trust in God that he will provide for their physical needs.

Presently we have ten attending baptismal classes. The teachers that received the Bibles are really enjoying them and now we have many people coming to us and asking if we have any left over.

Appeal for Needs

Water Well We appeal for help to build a 12 by 15-foot house over the well to secure it from contamination and vandalism. The house will also serve as storage for tanks to distribute water to the people. This project will cost \$2,360 USD. There is also need of a generator to pump water steadily at the site. That cost is \$600 USD. May God
