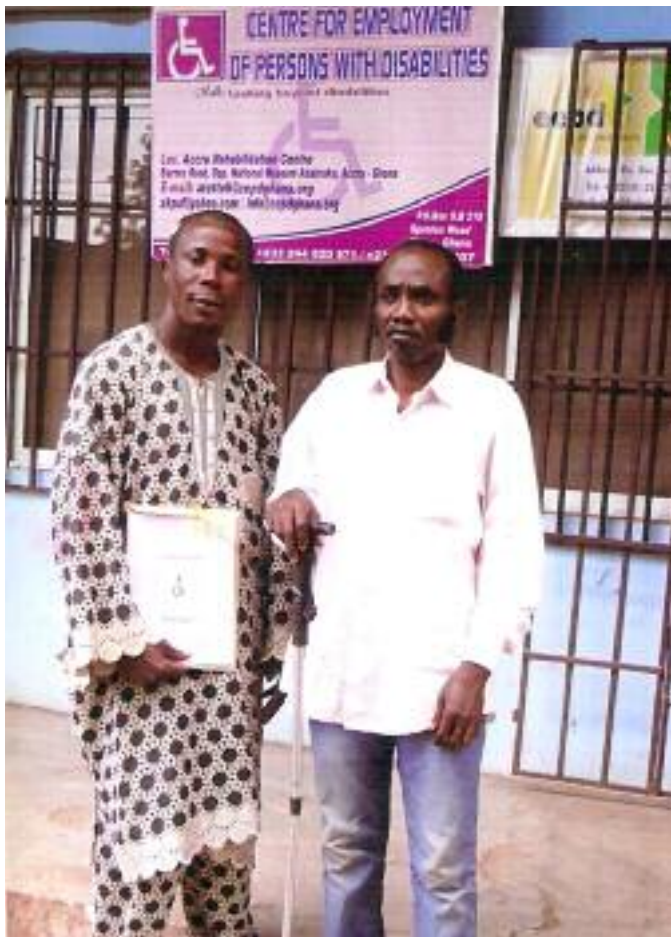

She had been taken to a different hospital that did not have a good reputation. When Pastor Adusei heard of this transfer, he went immediately to get Alobasi. He called us with the update and we instructed him that the money was would be sent for her surgery. Pastor Adusei told us that he would monitor the surgery and her recovery. We are so thankful for those who were faithful in helping fund this surgery to give Alobasi the ability to walk again.
