Report by Roy Wanta Mercy Antwi is a young widow, 34, whose husband died just three weeks ago. She is left with seven children to look after, including


four-year-old twins. His body is still in the mortuary, and the only thing he left for them is extreme poverty. Even his external family members are now struggling to raise money for his funeral according to their custom. You can imagine how Mercy and her children have been neglected. They are hungry and have no one to turn to because they are leaving in a very poor small community. Therefore, when Benjamin heard the news, he went there and gave them just a small amount of money that would last for only a day. The twins have been taken to a relative, away from their mother. According to their custom, the twins cannot stay with the family until their father has been buried, which should be around February, 2018.


"Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity." – 1 Timothy 4:12

but they are poor. They are pleading to "I Am" and the good people of the United States for some food support and help for Gifty to start a small business which will support herself and the other two children.


"...I rescued the poor who cried for help, and the fatherless who had none to assist them." – Job 29:12



Helena is the third child of Cecilia Mra, a widow. Helena is a 26-year-old single parent with a seven-year-old boy. She left her mother in Kumasi to go to Accra in search of a nonexistent job. After nine years of struggling in the capital city, the only result she got was to be impregnated by an unresponsible man who never took care of her and the child. She was left alone to take care of the child. An unfortunate accident

happened to her. Helena had been waiting in line with a number of people to get on a bus when a vehicle hit her and some of the others. The people who were standing with her were killed. The Lord spared her life; however, she received two broken legs. Everything Helena struggled for has been spent on medications, and now, she has nothing left. Pastor Benjamin and his wife bought a wheelchair for her to use after her discharge from the hospital.

Rose Paala is a poor widow, 64, who has four kids to look after. For a living, she sells kenkey, a local food. She fell sick and had no money to go to the hospital. Her church wasn't able to help her. It is a sad situation to travel around and see beautiful churches built with marble, and yet, no one really cares for a widow like this. They build huge massive buildings for



the glory of man and not God. Unfortunately, it is extremely rare to find people like Benjamin who seriously goes out of his way for the neglected, poor and defenseless.
