



As we are coming to the close of the year 2023 the Board of "I Am" World Mission Outreach, Inc. would like to extend our deepest gratitude for all the help that has been done, maybe monetary, prayers or just encouragement. The Lord YeHoVaH has heard the prayers of these people and put it on the hearts of many good people to help these women, children and families.

We would like to share the recap of all that has been done for the year and are humbled by it.

76 families with an average of 3 children in each family have been helped in some way or other.

All families had received food; 13 businesses were started; 18 families were placed in new homes instead of

living in unfit quarters, like a chicken coop. 25 wooden beds and mattresses were purchased (some of these people never slept on a mattress). Medical expenses were paid for a number of people otherwise they would have died. The school was able to expand with the purchase of table and chairs and book shelves and the hiring of teachers. This has been a blessed year and we are thankful for everyone making this all possible.

Roy is with **Millicent Frema** who is 72 years old. She's a very hard worker as a farmer planting various crops for food. She needs to hire some extra help and to get some farming tools and fertilizers so she can have a greater yield during harvest time. She does not want to be a burden on anyone and is determined to continue in her planting.

Idrisu Seidu and his family are so thrilled that they now have a stand to sell petty items to passer-bys. Idrisu was so ill and in the hospital but now he is able to be self-sustaining and provide for his family.





Beatrice Appiah is showing Roy her small poultry farm until Co-Vid 19 happened. She is 74 years old and doesn't want to depend on her children. She is asking if "I Am" Ministry could help her start up again.

Poulina Owusu, a widow is 72 years and has to take care of her 3 grandchildren. So often you will hear cases like this where the parents have died and now the grandmother has to care for the children. She is living in a place that the roof is leaking and not fit to live in with the three children. Pastor Benjamin would like to put them in a different place and then get them a bed and mattress and some food.





Lydia Eshun is 42 years old and has lost her husband 2 months ago. She has spent all her money trying to save him from his serious illness, but he did not survive. She was desperate for a place to live and for some food. Pastor Benjamin had requested help for her and now she has a place to live, a new bed and mattress and food to feed her children. She is so happy and she just can't believe that someone would help her.
